CVLC Transition Retreat, Sunday, January 23, 2022

You are invited to an afternoon of listening, seeking, discerning, and planning!

Transition in a congregation is rarely easy or smooth. Congregations are organized around relationships and Christus Victor has been blessed with Pr. Tom for over 25 years. That is a lot of relationship. Each of you has a Pr. Tom story and these stories have been woven together into a tapestry that is unique and beautiful.

The great news is that we have a God that is in this. Christ is our rock and our salvation that will be with us in and through it all – and provides shalom – the peace that brings hope.

The hope and plan for our ½ day retreat will be creating space to explore who and where you are as a community of faith in this moment – and lay out some dreams for the future. In preparation for the retreat, early in January you will be electronically sent a couple of short surveys to complete. These surveys will provide a picture, or view of this unique tapestry, for dialogue.

The product from the day is to bring you to a common understanding and goal as you approach Pr. Tom's retirement and laying out priorities for the important work of seeking a shepherd for Christus Victor's next phase of ministry

For those of you who will not be able to participate in the Retreat, this is your opportunity to have your voice be part of the conversation and discovery as you prepare for new pastoral leadership.

Your participation is important! In the shared quest for wholeness and community, let us gather together in joy and thanksgiving; and journey confidently into where God leads CVLC next.


A special thank you to Al Zipperle for filling in for me in December. It was so appreciated.


When I return, on January 23rd, we will read Chapter 3 of the book during that week's Sunday School.

Annual Stewardship Emphasis

“Think of us in this way, as servants of Christ and stewards of God’s mysteries. Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found trustworthy”. 1 Corinthians 4: 1-2

Stewards of God's mysteries! What intriguing words from the apostle Paul. In these verses from his first letter of the Corinthians, Paul begins to unpack this fascinating idea. Good stewards are trustworthy servants of Christ.

Our four-week stewardship emphasis called "Found Faithful" starts on January 9. We will focus on how to become more faithful stewards as we explore what it means to be:

found faithful
faithful in little
faithful with much; and
faithful with all.

Each week we will focus on one of these concepts during worship. January 30 is commitment Sunday when we will join one another in presenting our commitments of service and giving in support of the ministry and mission to which we are called as the CVLC congregation.

Stewardship

2022: Your year for generosity

“You will be enriched in every way for your great generosity!” -2 Corinthians 9:11

As you make resolutions and set goals for the New Year, be sure to include this one: “I will be more generous in 2022.” It will bless you – and your community and neighbor! The Bible makes clear that generosity leads to a more abundant life. Generous people experience one of those paradoxes of the Kingdom of God, where the last are first, the greatest is servant to all, and whoever loses her life for Christ will gain it.

The paradox? Generous people get back far more they give. First, a clarification: The paradox is NOT a financial strategy to maximize return on investment. That would be missing the point. Besides, there are more important things to give than money, such as time, service, kindness, forgiveness, compassion, love, and joy. And what we get back may not be quantifiable. How do you measure wellbeing and happiness?

Generosity’s real “payback” is what and who we become when we cultivate a habit of giving. Giving transforms us into generous-hearted people, and generous-hearted people tend to experience a real abundance of joy, peace, love, and security. The old saying is most certainly true: The open palm holds more than the closed fist.

For 2022, set a goal to be more generous. Start by increasing your charitable giving above last year’s offering, but also aim to give away your time, to serve your neighbor, to be lavish in compassion, extravagant in love. Pray that God will guide you and help you experience the paradox: Givers get back more than they give away.

Mary Martha Study January - April
The kingdom of God by the Rev. Mark Allan Powell
The kingdom of God: What does it mean for God to be in charge?



New Testament scholar Mark Allan Powell looks at a widely used biblical image and invites us into a discussion of what it might mean for Lutheran women today. The phrase “kingdom of God” and similar expressions turn up repeatedly in sayings of Jesus, so understanding what that expression means helps us to make sense of numerous parables and popular Bible passages (including the Lord’s Prayer). There may be some surprises: the phrase refers to an activity, not a location—and it has nothing to do with God being a “king,” at least so far as that image suggests a (usually male) tyrant who gives orders and dominates the lives of his subjects.

January 11 9:30a

Beautiful feet: Announcing the reign of God – The prophet Isaiah said, “How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of one who announces, “Your God reigns!” No one has ever fit the description better than Jesus, who talked more about the reign of God than he did about anything else. We will ask, what would it mean for God to be in charge of our lives? And why would that be good news?

February 8 9:30a

Mysteries of the kingdom: Parables, banquets and children – This month we will consider “kingdom parables” and ask how the kingdom of God is like a net or a treasure or a pearl or whatever. We will also look at an “acted parable” in which Jesus dramatizes the “kingdom” as a banquet where honored guests include misfits and outcasts. And then we will discover (or recall) who we should regard as the greatest in the kingdom and the most important members of any church. *(continued on next page)*

March 8 9:30a

Eternal life in the Gospel of John – In the fourth Gospel Jesus uses the expression “eternal life” to talk about what he calls the “kingdom of God” in the other Gospels. The phrase does not just refer to life that is eternally long, but also (indeed, especially) to life that is eternally deep—life that is endless in value and meaning. We will look at some popular passages, including John 3:16 and the story of Jesus and the woman at the well to discover how our lives can be marked by love and purpose.

April 12 9:30a

Looking to the future: Life forever with God – Most of the time that Jesus talks about the kingdom of God or eternal life, he is referring to something we experience here and now—not later in heaven. But sometimes, he does talk about that future life and in this final session we will learn as much as we can about “the glory that awaits us.” What will it be like to be perfect people in a perfect world, living forever with God and one another?
